Being an international anatomy conference meant that it attracted a large number of delegates within the anatomical community. This was an excellent opportunity to maintain and rekindle old relationships, as well as forge new ones. A couple of years ago at a previous AS conference, I befriended a delegate from Malta whom I wanted to keep in touch with but unfortunately had not; in August we were able to meet up again and talk about potentially collaborating on a project.

Many of the talks were very interesting including one on disruptive and constructive innovation in anatomy, and it was also interesting to learn that a new core curriculum in histology has been worked on. There was also a talk on looking at histology in 3D which I discussed with the speakers afterwards.

The poster presentations were also of high quality and I talked at length with a presenter who set up a graduate-entry medical degree programme.

The presenter I spoke with regarding the setup of the medical degree is somebody I am collaborating with now to look at tweaking an early-years medical curriculum. I learnt a lot from the poster regarding blueprinting of teaching against learning outcomes, and how to present information in a much more ergonomic way on the VLE.

With the work I am currently involved in with the revalidation of a medical curriculum, I am utilising some of the advice and approaches used in the setup of the new graduate-entry medical degree programme aforementioned.
